**WHEREAS**, the Rotary Club of Carol Stream is a member of Rotary International, the world's first, and still one of its largest, non-profit service organizations, founded in Chicago, Illinois, in 1905; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rotary motto "Service Above Self" inspires members to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards, and promote good will and peace in the world; and

WHEREAS, Rotary in 1985 launched PolioPlus and spearheaded the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, which today includes the World Health Organization, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, to immunize all the children of the world against polio; and

Executive Director Reuter reviewed the process to apply for the Community Development Block Grant. Two Letters of Intent were submitted to the DuPage County Community Development Department. We received the green light to proceed with our applications, which are due October 6, 2017. We will finalize our applications before the end of September. The Carolshire grant application will be for \$175,000. The ADA grant application will be for \$50,000. Both projects will have matching funds. Commissioner Bird asked where the grant money comes from. Executive Director Reuter explained it is Federal money provided by HUD. Commissioner Powers asked who administers the grant. Executive Director explained DuPage County has approval authority. It was verified the Village of Carol Stream is not applying for a grant. Only two grants will be available in each

municipality. Our staff is writing the grant. Commissioner Sokolowski asked if any ADA funds will be used for Carolshire. Executive Director Reuter confirmed that we are having cutouts installed at the entrance to the park using ADA funds. Executive Director Reuter emphasized the Resolutions will grant him authority to apply for the grants and sign agreements and other necessary documents related to the grants should funding be approved.

A. Resolution No. 17-04.

Commissioner Powers made a motion to approve Resolution No. 17-04 to authorize staff to submit an application to the DuPage County Community Development Commission for grant funding for Carolshire Park and to authorize the Executive Director to sign all agreements and other necessary documents related to the grant should funding be approved. #### Weekly Happenings

## ORDINANCE NO. 510 ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN PARK DISTRICT PERSONAL PROPERTY AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING SALE OR DISPOSAL

WHEREAS, the Carol Stream Park District, DuPage County, Illinois has accumulated certain personal property which has been used for various park purposes, specifically the items described in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, staff has determined that the subject items are beyond useful service life; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Park District Code authorizes the Park District to dispose of items of personal property, when in the opinion of three-fifths of the members of the Board of Park Commissioners then holding office such property is no longer necessary, useful to, or for the best interests of the Park District; and

WHEREAS, Park District staff has made preliminary arrangements for the disposal of the equipment and personal property through trade in, sealed bid auction, competitive bid, or salvage.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS OF THE CAROL STREAM PARK DISTRICT, DUPAGE COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

#### **Section One:**

It is hereby found and determined by the Board of Park Commissioners of the Carol Stream Park

District that the following item of personal property is no longer necessary, useful to or for the

best interests of this Park District:

A. The property described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

**Section Two:** 

That the park district staff is hereby authorized to convey or sell the personal property

described in Section One of this Ordinance in any manner that it may designate, with or without

advertising the sale, at any time following the adoption of this ordinance.

**Section Three:** 

This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by a three-fifths

majority of the members of this Board of Park Commissioners.

Section Four:

All prior ordinances, resolutions, motions, orders or policies in conflict herewith, be and the

same hereby are, repealed to the extent of the conflict herewith.

**Section Five:** 

If any clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unenforceable by a

court of competent jurisdiction or by operation of any applicable law, it shall not affect the

validity of any other clause or provision, which shall remain in full force and effect.
