The budget still has to be developed and the event will be run by a committee with staff from all departments. Matt Slanker's idea started with a car show and having Toys for Tots get involved to give back to the community. The entry fee to show the cars will be a toy. We can have special judging, like the Commissioner' Award and Kid's Choice. Division Manager Waghorne is really excited about all the possibilities with this event, like red and green snow cones, Christmas tree lighting and having Coral Cove open free to residents. We will promote our facilities and programs. Executive Director Reuter said we could have bingo and crafts inside. We could have a flick and float in the evening after the tree lighting. Commissioner Jaszka suggested having a band outside with a beer tent. Commissioner Jeffery likes that all ages will benefit and having the free entrance to the pool is a great idea. Commissioner Gramann thinks the car show will draw a lot of people and if we put the lights up on Simkus, it will draw a lot of attention to the event. Maybe we could have a Santa contest. Commissioner Powers suggested adding cultural celebrations. Commissioner Sokolowski said this is a good replacement for Just Play and CSBarks. Commissioner Gramann loves the team approach for planning the event.

	The Forever Young trip to the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum is coming up from September 10-14. Registration is still open; we currently have 46 participants registered with two open spots. The funds for the trip payment are covered by the registration fees paid by the participants, currently \$29,094 in revenue. The expenses to Diamond Tours will be charged to the Recreation Fund for the minimum amount of \$23,312, if we maintain at 46 participants. Payment may increase up to \$25,026 if registration increases. Commissioner Bird made a motion to approve payment to Diamond Tours Inc., Fort Meyers, Florida in the amount not to exceed \$25,026 for the Forever Young overnight trip to the Ark Encounter & Creation Museum. 	B. Forever Young Overnight Trip Payment – New Orleans		
	The Forever Young trip to New Orleans is scheduled for October 14-20. There are currently 47 participants registered. We are evaluating if a second bus can be added depending on enrollment and sufficient staffing. The funds for the trip payment are covered by the registration fees paid by the participants, currently \$35,105 in revenue. The expenses to Diamond Tours will be charged to the Recreation Fund for the minimum amount of \$28,373, if we maintain at 47 participants. Payment may increase up to \$60,684 if registration increases. Commissioner Bird made a motion to approve payment to Diamond Tours Inc., Fort Meyers, Florida in the amount not to exceed \$60,684 for the Forever Young overnight trip to the New Orleans. Seconded by Commissioner Gramann.
