A. Approval: Fountain View Recreation Center Roof Repair Bid Award Amendment
This amendment relates to the wording for the Fountain View Recreation Center Roof
Repair Bid Award. Jason Anselman from IAPD and corporate counsel recommended
we bring it back to the board as an amendment to maintain accurate records. As the
general contractor, Garland DBS, Inc., Cleveland, OH, conducted the public bid
process; RB Crowther Company submitted the lowest bid. The contract will be held by

Garland, not Crowther.

Commissioner Bird_made a motion to approve an amendment to award the base contract with Garland DBS, Inc., Cleveland, OH, for the Fountain View Recreation Center Roof Repair totaling \$113,382. Seconded by Commissioner Gramann. Roll Call Vote:

B. Approval: Utilities – Gas Contract Award

The Park District hired Scott Slobodecki of Lower Electric to act as our sourcing agent for the purchase of gas utilities. Rates change daily; Lower Electric has been monitoring them since September 5, 2018 in order to get the best rate possible for the District. They believe Constellation Energy to be a reputable option for the District. With Board approval, we will lock in the going rate as of this date.

Commissioner Powers asked Scott how his fee is paid. There is a nominal broker fee paid out over the term of the contract. Commissioner Bird asked Scott to explain what happens if the rates go down. Scott explained we don't expect that to happen but we will be locked in for rate we sign tonight for three years. One of the biggest benefits of the three year contract is the capacity rate also stays the same for the three years. If the gas rates were more volatile, he would not recommend a three year term, but these rates are pretty steady. We are eager to lock the gas rate in to avoid any increases as winter approaches.

Commissioner Gramann made a motion to approve Constellation Energy for Carol Stream Park District's natural gas services for a three year term beginning on October 8, 2018. Seconded by Commissioner Jeffery. Voice Vote. Motion Passed 5-0-0.

They believe Constellation Energy to be a reputable option for the District. Lower Electric has been monitoring rates since September 5, 2018 to capture the best rate possible for the District. With Board approval, we will lock in the going rate as of this date. Electricity rates have been flat; securing the rates for six separate locations will assure budget certainty over the term. Commissioner Powers made a motion to approve MP2 Electric for Carol Stream Park District's electric services for a three year term beginning on October 8, 2018. Seconded by Commissioner Gramann. Voice Vote. Motion Passed 5-0-0. D. Approval: Appointment of IAPD Conference Delegates The annual IAPD/IPRA State Conference is January 24-26, 2019 and will be held at the Hyatt Regency Chicago.
